## 2025-2026 Beach Haven Assessment Information to Parents and the General Public

New Jersey school districts, charter schools, and renaissance school projects are required by statute (*N.J.S.A.* 18A: 7C-6.6) to notify parents or guardians annually by October 1 of any statewide student assessment or commercially developed standardized assessment that will be administered over the school year. If, after October 1, it is decided that an additional commercially-developed standardized assessment will be administered, then the information shall be shared with parents as soon as possible (within 30 days of receipt of final reports for statewide assessments).

## Key:

- Information about Available Accommodations and Accessibility Features refers to the manual that outlines the accommodations and accessibility options available for the test.
- Required by State, Federal, or Local whether the assessment is required or mandated by state, federal, or local district.
- Sample Questions provide a link to sample items/questions for students to practice.
- **Testing Time Allotted per Student** is the maximum time students can complete the assessment. Most students finish well in advance of the allotted time.
- **Testing Window** is the period during which districts administer the assessment. It is not the number of days a student takes to complete the assessment. School districts can choose the specific days to administer the test within the window. Please ask your district about the exact testing dates for the assessment.
- **Results Available** refers to the date districts receive individualized student results from the assessment. These results should be distributed to students, educators, and families as soon as possible (within 30 days of receipt of final reports for statewide assessments).
